- transfer
- credentials/preparation for employment
- help students function in a changing world (diversity, sustainability, technology)
- fill an existing skills and knowledge deficit for h.s. graduates
- challenge individual connection to the world--application of knowledge
- develop citizens--fundamental operational view of the world

What do Associate graduates have that h.s. graduates don't?

- step of completion toward a higher degree
- ability to understand communication--communicate more effectively
- extended skills-math, communications, historical background
- higher order thinking skills-connection to maturity
- life skills

List gen ed skills and knowledge

- decision making/problem solving
- critical thinking
- ability to function in multiple environments (social, employment, educational)

- understanding of the world (sustainability, cultural awareness/diversity, tolerance, financial literacy, social responsibility, personal wellness)
- application, analysis, evaluation
- skilled communicator (read, write, speak)
- academic literacy (historical perspective, math, technology, communications)
