Academic Integrity

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Students are expected to adhere to standards of honesty in all areas of academic pursuit. Disciplinary Action

Students who violate academic standards must accept the consequences and/or penalties for their actions. Infractions of these rules will result in action by the instructor and/or administration of the college. Students who violate academic integrity standards will not be allowed to self-initiate a drop or withdrawal from a course or a total withdrawal from all courses to avoid penalties for their actions. Nursing Program Addendum

- Seek opportunities to expand learning experiences,
- Adhere to program policies
- Communicate therapeutically
- Practice kindness

The first professional conduct violations of personal integrity will result in counseling and probation, with documentation placed in the student's file. Further instances will result in recommendation for dismissal from the program.
