Tuition and Fees

- Cloud County Resident = \$103 per credit hour

Miscellaneous Course Fees

Internet course fees are \$25 per credit hour. Lab courses or other courses may have additional fees.

Housing

Housing charges include a cafeteria meal plan covering 17 meals per week.

Books and Supplies

The T-Bird Bookstore is available for students to purchase books. Students may use Federal Financial Aid credit to charge books and supplies from the CCCC Bookstore to the student account or students may choose to opt out of this opportunity. If you wish to opt out please complete the **Opt-Out Book Refund Form** located under **Quick Links** on CCCC's homepage and return to the Financial Aid Office.

Note: Book charges vary. There are book rentals, used books and new books.

Financial Assistance Guide

Scholarships

Scholarships can be applied to help pay for charges on the student account. Scholarships can include institutional scholarships from CCC (academic, athletic, activity, foundation) or outside scholarships from an outside donor.

Grants

Check your financial aid award letter regarding eligibility for federal grants. You can also call the Financial Aid Office to get general information regarding possible eligibility and amounts. After completion of the FAFSA Application at www.fafsa.gov, you should have received a confirmation page that stated preliminary aid eligibility. The amounts are listed for the entire academic year. Please take this into consideration when estimating semester charges and assistance.
